You will be assessed on the following criteria:

- 1. Past/current performance, behavior, and dedication to band program
- 2. Quality of your application and how well you handle working under pressure
- 3. Future leadership potential
- 4. Best fit for the organization/position
- 5. Musical ability

When completing the application, be thorough, complete, creative, and honest. Don't say what you think the directors may want to hear. Say what you think as an individual. Leaders are people who can offer something new and different to the organization. The application process is structured so that we will gain insights into you as a person, so please be honest and thorough. Getting the job should not be the end goal. The goal should be to grow as a young adult.

Please make sure that you complete the application, questions, and service project with the goal of "learning something".

When submitting your items, please be reminded that ALL ITEMS should be submitted in one package and clearly labeled with your name. All question responses are to be typed. All aspects of the process will be a part of the application rubric.

Please understand that if chosen, you will be held to a higher standard of behavior, performance, and work ethic than your peers. You must be willing to make that sacrifice as servant leaders so that those around you may succeed. Serving in this capacity will not only provide others with a better experience but will provide you with a tremendous growth opportunity that will serve you for years to come.
